## Irregular Past Participle Verbs

To form the past tense form of most verbs, you simply add -ed to the end of the word.

Present tense: I **walk** to the cafe.  
Past tense: I **walked** to the cafe.  
Past participle: I had **walked** to the cafe.

Irregular verbs are a bit more difficult because you don't add -ed to make them past tense. The whole word changes depending on its tense.

Present tense: I **eat** a carrot.  
Past tense: I **ate** a carrot.  
Past participle: I have **eaten** a carrot.
