Double Negatives: Other Negative Words

Only one negative word is needed to express a negative idea in a sentence.

When two negative words are used in the same sentence, it is called a **double negative**.

Common negative words are no, not, none, nothing, never, nobody, nowhere, neither, and contractions using not.

There are also less common adverbs that express negative ideas.

Double Negative: There are *hardly no* cookies left.

Correct: There are *hardly* any cookies left.
