Singular nouns (one person or thing) are made possessive by adding an apostrophe and then an s.

example: the basket that belongs to the boy

Plural nouns (more than one person or thing) are made possessive by adding an apostrophe after the s.

example: the basket that belongs to two girls

the girls' basket
