



















# Thanksgiving Bingo

## Materials:

- blank bingo board (one per student)
- Thanksgiving picture squares  
(one sheet per student, plus an extra copy to use as calling cards)
- scissors
- glue

## Setting up the game boards:

- Students cut out the Thanksgiving picture squares.
- Students glue them in random order on their bingo board.

## Playing the game:

- The caller will randomly select Thanksgiving words from a bowl.
- When an item is called, all players mark it on their bingo board.
- The first player to get five items in a straight line (horizontally, vertically, or diagonally) wins.

## Notes to teacher:

- This game can be played with your whole class, or students can play in small groups.
- You may want to offer a small prize for the winners.
