
Materials:

- Scissors
- Brass paper fastener
- Cipher wheel (pages 2 and 3 of this worksheet)
- Insects Cipher Code Fact Cards (pages 4 through 7 of this file)

Assembling the Cipher Wheel

- **Step 1:** Print the cipher wheels on thick card stock.
- Step 2: Carefully cut out the inner and outer wheel.
- **Step 3:** Attach the inner wheel to the outer wheel, using a brass paper fastener.








Suggestions for Teachers

In order for the wheel to work correctly, the brass paper fastener must be pushed through the exact center of the wheel. Your students may need help with this step.

Have students save their cipher wheel for future activities. We have cipher code fact cards covering many topics on *SuperTeacherWorksheets.com*.

The entire activity does not need to be completed in one day. You may want to have students work on this activity for a short period of time each day until they've completed all of the fact cards.




Insects Fact #3
