
# **Counting Money Matching Game**

# **Objective:**

This game is played like the memory match card game that many children are familiar with. It is designed to reinforce their understanding of counting money.

## Set up:


Copy the cards on card stock.


Cut the cards on the dotted lines.

# How to play:


There are many ways to use these cards. Here are two possibilities.


- 1. You may have students simply match the amounts with the correct picture amounts. Have them count the coins as they do this.
- 2. Use the cards to play a memory-match game with 2 or more students. Flip the cards upside down. Students take turns flipping pairs of cards in an attempt to find a matching pair. Pairs of matching cards are kept by the player. The student with the most cards at the end of the game is the winner.





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
