Possessive Nouns

A noun that shows ownership is a possessive noun.

To turn a noun into a **possessive noun**, add an **apostrophe (')** and an - **s** to the singular noun.

examples:

The boy's favorite basketball team won last night.

The girl's dress was pink.

The words boy's and girl's are possessive nouns. By adding an **apostrophe** and an - s to the singular noun we turn it into a possessive.
