The Pentagon

Most buildings are squares or rectangles. Some are oval-shaped, like sports stadiums. Buildings in other shapes like triangles or octagons are rare. However, there is a famous five-sided building in the United States—and it has a very important job.

The Pentagon is located on one side of the Potomac River, across from the nation's capital, Washington, D.C. Even though it's built in Virginia, it's still





President Franklin D. Roosevelt needed a new building. There were only two requirements. First, it had to use as little steel as possible. Steel needed to be saved for the war. Second, it couldn't be taller than 5 floors. They spent two years and over \$83 million (over \$1 billion today!) making a new headquarters.

In 1943, the Pentagon finished construction. Its insides were later renovated, or rebuilt and updated, between 1998 and 2011.

The U.S. military performs, or carries out, operations in the Pentagon. Branches like the Army, Navy, and Air Force all use the building. But the DOD is more than just the military! Over 26,000 people work in the Pentagon. Many are civilian, meaning they aren't in the



military. Some perform jobs like gathering intelligence to help the government and military make decisions. Many make sure money is spent on the correct projects. Others are lawyers who make sure everyone else follows the law. A lot of the work is keeping clear records. In fact, most of the 6.5 million square feet of floor space looks just like a busy office. The Pentagon is the largest office building in the world!

So why five sides? The place where the Pentagon was supposed to be built was kind of shaped like a pentagon. The building location changed later. But President Roosevelt liked the design so much that he kept it anyway!

The Pentagon is built with 5 rings, or bands of rooms,
