## Two Kinds of Verbs

An action verb shows us what the subject does.

**examples:** The movie starts in fifteen minutes.

Liam bought a bucket of popcorn.


We raced to our seats.

A **linking verb** connects the subject to a noun or adjective in the predicate that tells us what the subject is.

examples: The popcorn was buttery.

Sophie and Thomas seemed frightened.
