### Two Kinds of Verbs

Every sentence has at least one verb.

In some sentences, the subject does something. These sentences contain **action verbs**.

**examples:** Two actors <u>danced</u> across the stage.

After that, a woman with red hair sang a solo.

In other sentences, more information is given about the subject. These sentences contain **linking verbs**. Linking verbs connect the subject to a noun or adjective in the predicate. The noun or adjective renames or describes the subject.

**examples:** The actors were students from my school.
