Adverbs

An **adverb** is a word that describes a verb.

An adverb tells how, when, or where the verb happens.

Many adverbs that tell how end with the letters -ly.

example: Joan painted slowly.

Slowly describes the action painted.

When you compare two actions, the adverb will often end with the letters -er or -est.

examples: Birds fly higher than insects.

Higher describes the verb fly.

Francine walked dangerously close to the edge.


