Some of us bite people too. Our poison can make them sick. Most of us spin webs. These webs catch insects for us.

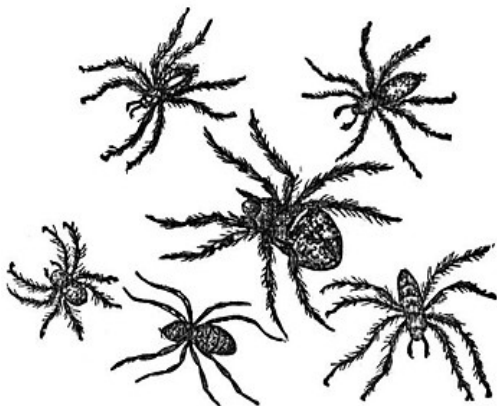



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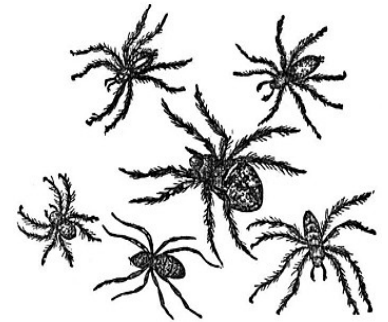
