## Coordinating Conjunctions: Compound Sentences

Independent clauses are complete sentences. Two or more can be joined together with a comma and a coordinating conjunction to create a compound sentence. Different conjunctions suggest different relationships between the clauses.

**example:** Keanu was excited. He was finally getting a dog!

Keanu was excited, **for** he was finally getting a dog!

The conjunction **for** emphasizes that getting a dog is why Keanu was excited.
