

Assembling the Cipher Wheel

Step 2: Carefully cut out the inner and outer wheel.


Suggestions for Teachers

In order for the wheel to work correctly, the brass paper fastener must be pushed through the exact center of the wheel. Your students may need help with this step.


Have students save their cipher wheel for future activities. We have cipher code fact cards covering many topics on SuperTeacherWorksheets.com.
