| <p style="text-align: center;">be a good sport</p>  | <p><i>meaning:</i> someone who loses gracefully, without complaining</p> <p><i>sentence:</i> Even though she didn't win the spelling bee, Mary was a good sport and congratulated the winner.</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">fed up</p>  | <p><i>meaning:</i> annoyed</p> <p><i>sentence:</i> Our teacher said she is fed up with our behavior in class.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">make big money</p>  | <p><i>meaning:</i> a lot of money</p> <p><i>sentence:</i> Even though he doesn't make big money, Jim loves his job at the pet shop.</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">shooting his/her mouth off</p>  | <p><i>meaning:</i> talking too much without thinking</p> <p><i>sentence:</i> Peter was shooting his mouth off about his perfect grades in class.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">jack up the price</p>  | <p><i>meaning:</i> raise the price</p> <p><i>sentence:</i> Since he was the only mechanic in town, Bill jacked up the price of an oil change.</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">fair weather friend</p>  | <p><i>meaning:</i> friend who is only around for good times or fun things, but not in a time of need</p> <p><i>sentence:</i> Tim is always around when I want to play, but when I needed help, he wasn't</p> |
