Secondary Sources

Secondary sources are **secondhand** accounts or descriptions. They are made by people who were not present to see or experience something themselves.

Secondary sources **must** build on primary or other secondary sources.

Commentaries or critiques of original content or research in subject areas like language arts and science are also considered secondary sources.

- artwork showing specific events the artist was not present to
