# Primary and Secondary Sources

Sources are materials that provide information about an event or topic. Documents, visual media, sound recordings, and physical objects are all sources. Some people only think of social studies when they think of sources. However, sources exist in all subject areas. No matter the subject area, there are always two main kinds of sources.

Primary sources are made by people who were there to see or experience something themselves. They are firsthand accounts. A letter from a WWI soldier and unedited film from a journalist are primary sources. So are objects and buildings made during the time being studied. Original fiction works like novels or a scientist's research data are primary sources too.

Secondary sources are secondhand accounts. They are made by people who did not experience something themselves. They must comment on or help explain primary sources. Sometimes they even comment on other secondary sources! Think of a textbook that gives information from the soldier's letter. A documentary film edited to tell a
