Possessive Pronouns

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun. Possessive pronouns show that a noun belongs to someone or something.

Possessive Pronouns Before a Noun

Certain possessive pronouns must come right before a noun.

my, your, his, her, its, our, their

Examples: Miauel drove his car to the airport.



Possessive Pronouns Without a Noun

Some possessive pronouns can take the place of the object that belongs to the antecedent.

mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs

Examples: The bright purple suitcase is *hers*.

The taxi over there is **ours**.
