Subject and Object Pronouns

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun. We use different types of pronouns depending on the pronoun's function in the sentence.

Subject Pronouns

Subject pronouns replace a noun in the subject of a sentence. Subject pronouns tell who or what is doing something in a sentence. They are used before the verb in a sentence.

I, you, he, she, it, we, they



Object pronouns replace a noun in the predicate of a sentence. Object pronouns tell to what or to whom something is being done. They are used after the verb in a sentence.

me, you, him, her, it, us, them

Examples: Mom asked Isaiah to bring the cookies to **them**.

Elijah baked cookies with **me** on Saturday.
