When you use a pronoun in a compound subject or a compound object, you must make sure the pronoun is correct. It helps to look at the sentence without the other noun to help you decide which type of pronoun to use.

Subject Pronoun

example:

Every summer, (he / him) and Elijah spend a week camping.

Every summer, he spends a week camping.

Object Pronoun

example:

Mom told (she / her) and Lindsay to pack bug spray and sunscreen.

Mom told her to pack bug spray and sunscreen.
