



Over time, modern machines began to put Newfoundland's pony out of work. Owners faced pressure to stop their ponies from breeding. New anti-roaming laws kept them from turning their ponies out when not in use. Some owners couldn't afford to care for their ponies year-round. The meat truck offered the best price for those looking to sell.

In 1997, the province passed an act to protect the Newfoundland pony. Now owners need a permit to take a pony out of the province. This helps make sure they only go to good homes and breeders. The act also put in place a process to register, promote, and protect the breed. These duties are handled by the Newfoundland Pony Society.


