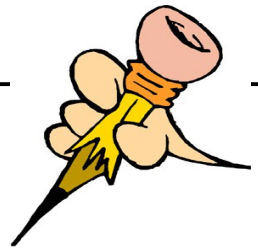

or pink or boom or zing



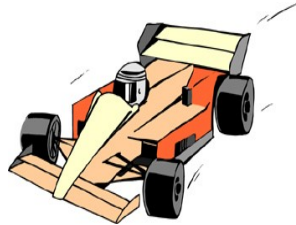
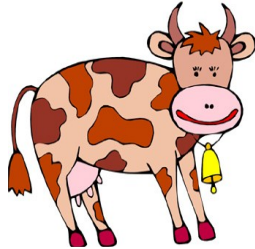
