The island is Madagascar, and the primate is the lemur.


There are more than 100 species of lemurs. They are related to mankeys

Most lemurs live in groups called troops.

An older dominant female decides where and when the group will move. Group living provides many eyes, noses, and ears for detecting predators. Predators include the fossa, a cat-like relative of the mongoose.

Large snakes and birds of prey like hawks are additional predators.

Some lemur species are herbivores. These eat fruit, leaves, flowers, seeds, and bark. Others are omnivores. They eat both plants and animals such as insects, spiders, and even small birds.

Both males and females use scent glands to communicate and mark territory. During breeding season the most successful males are those who create the largest stink!

Lemurs also communicate with sound. Small mouse lemurs chirp.

Another lemur, the indri, makes a spooky wailing sound. In fact, the word "lemur" comes from a word that means "ghost."

The number of young born depends on the species.

One young at a time is most common. In most species, the young cling to the mother's
