Representative Samples

Samples that are **representative** of a population accurately reflect the population. Two of the most important factors that make a sample representative are **sample size** and **sampling method**.

- Larger samples tend to be representative. When samples are too small to gather sufficient data, they are unlikely to be representative.
- Random samples tend to be representative. When samples are biased, they are unlikely to be representative.

If the sample is <u>unlikely</u> to be representative, check one or both boxes to tell why. If the sample is <u>likely</u> to be representative, check <u>no</u> boxes.
