
Subjects & Predicates

The **subject** of a sentence tells who or what the sentence is about.

The **predicate** of a sentence tells what the subject does or is.

example: A man with a bow tie rode his bike to the store.

*A man with a bow tie is the subject, and
rode his bike to the store is the predicate.*
