Any pet not fully domesticated or native to the place it's kept is an exotic pet. Even common ones like snakes and parrots often require special care. Hedgehogs are one exotic pet growing in popularity. These pocket-sized, porcupine-like pets are pretty cute. Think twice before buying one, though.

Firstly, hedgehogs are nocturnal. That means you might not see them much during daytime. Plus, spines aside, most aren't cuddly. I hope you like bugs, too! Hedgehogs need them in addition to seeds and roots. They also need big cages. Perhaps most importantly, they must be kept away from direct sun and drafts. Temperatures outside of about 75–85°F make them sick and can even kill them. Is worrying about all of that worth it?
