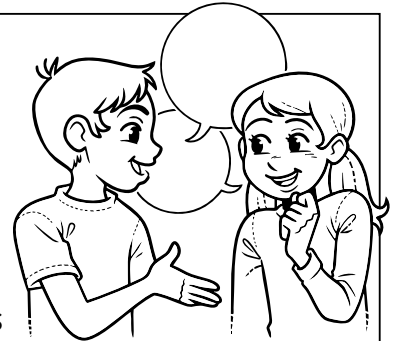

Shades of Meaning: Verbs

Synonyms and other groups of words used to describe similar ideas often have small but important differences in meaning. Always use the most accurate verb. Strong, descriptive verbs help readers better picture and emotionally connect with the text.

- I **spoke** with Saoirse. —→ basic; not very descriptive
I **chatted** with Saoirse. —→ describes a friendly conversation
I **gossiped** with Saoirse. —→ describes a conversation about rumors
I **consulted** with Saoirse. —→ describes a formal or professional conversation



Each verb in the table expresses a basic action. Think of at least **four** different, more descriptive verbs or verb phrases that express a similar action. Use a thesaurus if necessary.

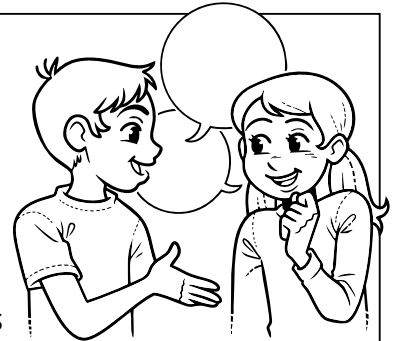
